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## **New Websites about Legion Apostolic Schools**

***Sacred Heart and Immaculate Conception help boys to discern possible vocations to the priesthood***

Two Legion of Christ apostolic schools in the United States now have new websites.



The newest website, <http://www.icasnh.org/>, was recently launched by the Immaculate Conception Apostolic School in Center Harbor, New Hampshire.

And at the beginning of the 2013-2014 school year, Sacred Heart Apostolic School in Rolling Prairie, Indiana, launched its new website, <http://www.sacredheartapostolicschool.org/wp/>.

The user-friendly websites are designed to answer the questions of prospective students and their parents, offering details on school mission statements, programs, curriculum, accreditation and tuition information and the formation process.

Both schools help their students discern a possible vocation to the priesthood in a missionary order, congregation or diocese. The goal of both schools is to aid student discernment, with close support from parents, in an age-appropriate and gradual manner. The schools offer a college preparatory curriculum to build a solid foundation for a future educational path into a major seminary, or the college of their choice.

“We seek to develop the seeds of a priestly vocation so that our students may more easily recognize it and be in a better position to respond to it,” said Fr. Steven Liscinsky LC, an alumnus and now Dean of Studies at Immaculate Conception.

“The religious family spirit and character formation we offer prepares the young man to follow Christ with generosity of spirit and purity of heart,” said Fr. Daren Weisbrod LC, Admissions director at Sacred Heart.

The Legion of Christ has 12 apostolic schools across the world, including

the two in the United States, as well as in Italy, Germany, Spain, France, Mexico, Brazil, Columbia, and Venezuela.

Sacred Heart Apostolic School in Rolling Prairie, Indiana opened its doors in the fall of 2005 in the former Le Mans Academy building. Since then, more than 100 students have studied at the school, with 50% of graduates continuing on to the Legion of Christ's novitiate in Cheshire, Connecticut, or to diocesan seminaries. The school is located in northern, rural Indiana near Lake Michigan and the Warren Dunes.

Immaculate Conception Apostolic School was founded, and approved by the New Hampshire State Department of Education, in 1982. Since then, over 700 students have gone through the program, with more than 60 alumni now ordained priests. The school is located in New Hampshire's White Mountain and Lakes region.

Sacred Heart and Immaculate Conception both



offer active and challenging schedules that balance activities in four quadrants: spiritual depth, character building, intellectual development and apostolic action.

Students learn to put God first in their lives, with scheduled daily prayer and regular Mass attendance. They benefit from small class sizes and a low student-teacher ratio that assures each student receives personalized attention. They receive one-on-one mentoring from Legionary priests to help them in their discernment process and formation. They also participate in monthly retreats and Ignatian spiritual exercises once a year.

Students participate in intramural athletics, including soccer, basketball, baseball and other activities, and have lots of opportunities for outings to enjoy the outdoors.

## Forming Faithful Families

***Jim Littleton talks about his new ministry, his life as a cancer survivor, husband and father of 14 children***

*James Littleton and his wife Kathleen have been members of Regnum Christi for much of their married lives. Fourteen children later, and after surviving a life-threatening bout with cancer, Jim and Kathleen have started a ministry, "Forming Faithful Families," to aid in the New Evangelization. Following is an interview with Jim providing more details.*

**First of all, please give us an update on your health? How are you feeling?**

I have been doing very well. By the grace of God I am still cancer free since All Saints Day, 2011. I had a little set back wherein I was hospitalized with H1N1 influenza and double pneumonia in January, but by the marvels of our loving Father, I bounced back quickly to 100%. Thanks be to God! The management medications I take for my bone marrow/adult stem cell transplant lower my immune system, so picking up bugs can be more serious for me. But our merciful Father is in command of the life and health of each person, so we are all in good Hands. Every moment of every day is a gem of a gift from God.

**Any major developments or news with your family you can share?**

My wife Kathleen will be graduating in June with a Masters in Pastoral Theology from the Institute of Pastoral Theology of Ave Maria University.

And our most exciting news is that Kathleen and I are grandparents with our first grandchild expected to be born in April to their amazing parents, Ryan and our daughter Tara Reeves.

Our fourteen children now range in age from 28 to 8. The oldest of our two sons is in the college seminary for the Archdiocese of Chicago

discerning the priesthood. Three daughters obtained Masters degrees this past year, one in Biblical Theology and two in Literature. A fourth daughter will start her Masters this year at the University of Chicago, and another daughter is thriving as a Montessori educator. Our high-school-age children attend St. Ignatius College Prep, and the four youngest keep us young at heart and appreciative still of the gift of small children in our lives.

**Can you give me details on the website “Forming Faithful Families”?**

Forming Faithful Families is a Catholic family ministry in service to the New Evangelization, offering parish-based and small faith community programs, retreats, services and resources. human level, Kathleen and I hope not, because it is very hard work. But if God were to call us, I am sure we would say yes.


We really want to focus now on creating awareness about our current publications. (Go to our website to find out

Besides our books, storefront ministry, and speaking engagements, we are involved in the new evangelization of spreading the good news of the love and mercy of Jesus Christ for all of his children through radio media work, and in the future perhaps some video and television work.

**You seem to find time to do a great many apostolates. How, and why, do you do them all and still find time for your family?**

We pour ourselves into our apostolates as a response to the amazing love and mercy Jesus has poured into our souls. We are re-invigorated daily at Holy Mass, and by receiving the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus. So our apostolic work is simply an overflow of the gift of our spiritual lives and grace made available to us through the Catholic Church.

Kathleen and I take one day at a time. We try to live by a Hierarchy of Values (see our book [Better by the Dozen, Plus Two](#) for more details) which includes not neglecting our spouse and children, but rather being present to them and loving them. Of course there is always some element of struggle in maintaining this proper balance, but we try to live immersed in God's wonderful will doing what He inspires us to do, a little each day, a little at a time; and it is amazing how much this adds up, how much God can accomplish for His beloved children through each of us, His children, in this manner.

Also the center

of operations for most of our ministry, The Family Hearth, located in Frankfort, Illinois, just a short three blocks walk from our home. It's like another home where our family gathers and helps others. Our slogan is "Honoring Home, Faith and Family Life." There we sell fresh coffee and tea, gifts, home décor items and books. We offer spiritual guidance, life coaching and faith sharing programs such as:

- Scripture Reflection Group on Tuesdays at 5:30 pm
- Christian Cancer Support Group on Thursdays at 5:30 pm.
- Women's Book Study Group on Mondays at 10 am.
- Women's Prayer Group on Fridays at 1 pm.

We also started a ministry called "One More Baby for Jesus." The purpose is to create awareness and bring the Catholic Church's beautiful teachings on the openness to life and the sanctity of life down to a simple, concrete application in daily family life. We like to present this way of life, not as an imposition, but the sharing of a gift, an invitation.

**Tell me about your radio show.**

Kathleen and I have begun a program with Radio Maria called *Forming Faithful Families*. The weekly program is in service to the New

Evangelization, and consists of reflections and anecdotes pertaining to our Catholic faith, scripture, the sacraments, the Eucharist, the Blessed Virgin Mary, prayer, marriage, family, parenting, openness to life, forgiveness and much more. We reflect on the certainty of the infinite personal love of Jesus for each of us, that He is supremely interested and in control of every detail of our lives, and that He is always bringing the greatest good out of everything for us.

Forming Faithful Families is full of encouragement and imbued with an assurance that our awesome and merciful Father is constantly performing “marvels of love” (Ps.31) in our lives. We will walk closely with you as we persevere down the road of Love together. When we have Jesus, we have everything!”

**Can you give any words of encouragement for discouraged “faithful Catholics” out there who are distressed with our country and world right now?**

Every age has its trouble and we will always have trouble in the world. Don't be weighed down by this! Our Lord Jesus anticipated this. He said: “In the world you will have trouble, but be brave: I have conquered the world (John 16:33).” Only in Jesus will we find peace. When we have the sublime peace of Jesus, we are able to share that peace with others and that peace truly can spread across the world.

Do we really think there are storms in our lives, currently raging or yet to come, that are beyond our blessed Lord's power? We must be convinced there is nothing that will ever happen or can ever happen that is beyond the power and control of our loving and merciful God. We are invincible when we take Jesus into our boat. Nothing can harm us then, nothing! Don't doubt. Count on this! (See Better by the Dozen,

Plus Two.)

It all comes down to love, love and love again. We receive love and we give love. If we can live in love, we will not fear. As our loving Father tells us repeatedly, and as Blessed John Paul II, the Great, would constantly proclaim: "Be not afraid!" Fear is not of God. "In love there can be no fear, but fear is driven out by perfect love: because to fear is to expect punishment, and anyone who is afraid is still imperfect in love. We are to love, then, because he loved us first." (1John 4:18-19, JB).

I give lots of insight in my book, Healed through Cancer and Other Adversities. We must become like St. Paul, "overwhelmed by the love of Christ." (see 2 Corinthians 5:14). We need to ask the Holy Spirit to gift us with an unshakeable faith. We will become like Mount Zion, a "Mountain Fortress" in Christ. "Those who trust in Yahweh are like Mount Zion, unshakeable, standing forever" (Psalm 125:1, JB).

**Anything you would like to add?**

Without a special grace, a divine strengthening, Kathleen and I are convinced that no one can come to know, accept, embrace, live, and persevere in the Church's gift of truth in our culture today – to know the truth about the essence and meaning of marriage, the pivotal role of the family, openness to life and chastity according to one's state in life. This will come first and foremost through a Eucharistic revolution of individuals and families committed to the gift of daily Mass, Eucharistic Adoration, Spiritual Communion, and prayer, including scripture. From this approach will flow work in the arena of evangelization - empowered by grace, overflowing from our spiritual lives, from our union with God.

A few summers ago, I was called way out of my comfort zone by the Holy Spirit, through my dear friend Rachel, to be on a parish renewal “travel team.” My particular role was to be the prayer support for those giving and those receiving the weekend renewal retreat. My assignment was to spend the weekend in front of our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament in a tiny parish chapel. Rachel and I had just had a coffee at our local mall, were deep in a conversation about our history curricula, as homeschool moms, and we had left the café to walk and talk. Educating our children “for eternity,” as one lovely Catholic provider of homeschooling materials puts it, was foremost on our hearts and minds.

Then, the Spirit moved Rachel. She asked me to do this weekend “job” and could I please come to our parish this Sunday evening and, if all present affirmed my call, I would join the team for formation weekends for the next three months before giving the retreat at a different parish (hence, “travel team”) in late fall. Well, okay, here we go.

I had asked Rachel for coffee because I was stressed out and feeling a bit overwhelmed with homeschooling, and our Merciful Savior thought it best for my salvation for me to give more, not less, as I had planned.

“God will not be outdone in generosity,” we are often exhorted. We know it. We experience it.

We really do experience this in a deep and moving way; and, yet, if you are like me, the experiences sometimes fade, fade even unto a sort of “spiritual

amnesia,” a certain forgetfulness of all the miracles God works in our lives and the lives of our loved ones. Yes, we pray to be more loving, more open to His promptings, more like Him and like His holy mother, who is the “Seat of Wisdom.” Still, in the moment, our weak flesh trembles.

Oh my goodness did our awesome God flood me, and later He flooded our family, with graces and blessings from that renewal weekend! One of the biggest graces was in such a small thing: the clean, white linen altar cloth under the monstrance was most lovingly embroidered in red with the words, “O Living Flame of Love!” My little blue Regnum Christi prayer book was in hand much of the weekend; and, at one point, I wrote this out in the front flap. Since that weekend, I often pray it with my morning prayers asking our Lady to take my heart to her Son and to set it on fire for souls. Yes, our Lord is alive and truly present in the Holy Eucharist so ready to set our entire body, mind, soul and spirit on fire for love of souls. We are meant to be what we receive, a tall order indeed.

Lent is about hope and healing, forgiving and giving. There is no giving Him, if He cannot abide in us. Herein lies a deep and beautiful mystery. The Lord of Lords, King of Kings and Prince of Peace will abide in sinners. We are all sinners and also pilgrims called to reach out to other sinner-pilgrim souls.

Called to reach out of our comfort zones, to hear the call and to drop our fears and reservations and go. We are like candles that in burning are made smaller.

I recently found myself being asked to make a little handful of “leaps of faith,” in some ways, not as big as was this weekend. The pattern was the same: less me, more Him. So, as we enter in to what will surely be a Lent of trials, let us all pray with great fervor for each other’s intentions and needs. Persevering together in our hardships is a sign of hope and will keep us on the path to Heaven.

*Oh, Living Flame of Love, enkindle our hearts, and enlighten our minds, to desire with every fiber of our being the way to eternity, Your Holy Way. We ask this for all of us in our beautiful ecclesial family, brothers and sisters in the Most Precious Blood of Christ Jesus, under our Lady’s ever protective mantle of protection. Amen. Alleluia!*



## Ten Attitudes

*In his previous article, Fr. William Serra LC reflected on the need and benefits of opening up our wounds to Christ in prayer. (<http://live.regnumchristi.org/2013/11/letting-christ-heal-my-wounds-in-prayer/>.) This article reflects on ten attitudes that help us open our wounds in prayer to the Divine Physician, who reaches out to heal us, showing us how to experience Mercy in the midst of our misery.*

1. Openness of Heart: come to prayer with an open heart, a spirit free of self-concern, and a willingness to lay bare one's wounds. Openness

unburdens the soul and raises it into God's loving presence, entering into the very heart of Mercy.

2. Gratitude: begin by thanking the Divine Physician. Thank Him for everything, both for what He gives and what He takes. When He takes, it is only to give even more. Everything is His loving gift. Thank Him for His guidance and care.

3. Contrition: experience the sorrow that comes, not from seeing oneself as imperfect, but for having offended Christ, your friend. Contrition flows from love and out of love.

4. Joy: trusting in Christ's healing power, we share in His joy, because He desires to heal us. We should gladly and confidently receive His healing.

5. Love: it is love, not fear, which drives us to the Divine Physician to pray, "Lord, I have offended you. I have loved little." Let His Word pierce your soul, and let your heart walk in the Love that knows no end.

6. Wonder: admire His healing touch that makes us clean. Live the mystery of His wounds, which have healed you.

7. Amnesia: God suffers from forgetfulness. He does not remember our sins. His forgiveness is total and complete. Who are you to worry about something He no longer remembers? Forget your sins and remember only His mercy.

8. Praise: Be in awe of Him, who is so close and so mighty, yet He respects your freedom. He waits and does not push.

9. Friendship: Renew your friendship with Him, a friendship sealed through each confession, by your openness and His mercy. His blood mingles with yours to cleanse you and purify you.

10. Accept the Father's Embrace: experience the embrace of the Father of Mercies. His unconditional love forgives all. This Father hugs you so tightly you can barely breathe. Resolve to love Him more and better, and not to offend this loving Father again.




The cost is \$14.95 per CD, or \$25 for two. All proceeds from the purchase of this CD will help raise funds for the Atlanta consecrated community.

## The Truth about Women's Health

One of the things I find most frustrating about our culture is the blindness regarding what is healthy for women. Turn on the news and you will see pink 10K fundraisers to end breast cancer, and red awareness days for heart health, and the myriad of discussions on healthy eating and lifestyle change. “Natural” is a buzz word.

Except when it comes to women’s reproductive health.

Put that word in front of “Family Planning” and everybody rolls their eyes and turns to the so-called experts who are pushing artificial birth control.

I remember when I was having my own issues with ovarian cysts; every doctor I saw wanted to treat this with, you guessed it, Artificial Birth Control Pills. I did some research, and I finally found a doctor who bothered to do his research, and could address the cause of my problems. (More on that later.)

The dangers of artificial birth control are documented fact. Just open the warning booklet that comes with any pill prescription, or listen to the fast-forwarded information they throw in after the happy, dancing images of young girls at the end of television ads for the Pill.

I watched an interview last night on [EWTN Live with Fr. Mitch Pacwa](#). His guests were OBGYN Dr. Thomas Hilgers and his wife, who are representatives from the [Paul VI Institute](#) in Omaha, Nebraska. They are champions for [NaPro Technology](#) (Natural Procreative Technology.)

One of the startling statements made by Dr. Hilgers -- who has an impressive resume of experience, by the way -- is that whenever a young woman in her 20's comes into the emergency room with an embolism or stroke (which actually happens more than you would think) she is usually on the birth control pill.

In the following [YouTube interview](#) with Dr. Hilgers, he makes an amazingly straightforward statement (considering that most doctors are quick to put 16-year-old girls on the pill for various reasons, including acne – I had one try to do this to my own daughter):

“If you ask yourself as an Obstetrician Gynecologist, would I want my wife to be on birth control pills, the answer is no. So if I wouldn't put my wife on them, why would I put anybody else on them?”

Thank God for physicians like Dr. Hilgers, and the wonderful Michigan doctor I mentioned earlier, Dr. Daniel Greene. (Read the article about his presentation given last year at the Queen of the Family Retreat Center in Oxford, Michigan, [here](#).)
